Merry Christmas! I greet you in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

I hope that you had a good Thanksgiving and family reunion. I also had a good Thanksgiving. I invited friends to my home and we had a good time. It was a precious time to reflect upon the

blessings I have received throughout the year.

I was quite busy in November, with All Saints Sunday, Stewardship Sunday, visits to the local public schools, Christ the King Sunday, 1st Advent Sunday, etc. All Saints Sunday was a good opportunity for the church to reconnect with those who passed away last year. I read their names during the service while we looked at their photos on the screen and reflected upon the influence each person had on Emmanuel's heritage.

On November 9th and 11th, Helen Akers and I visited High Point High School and Beltsville Academy, bringing coffee and doughnuts as a token of gratitude. Our visit was welcomed by the school staff and teachers. They appreciated the coffee and doughnuts.

On November 15th, Emmanuel hosted the funeral service for Donald Galloway. Don's wife, Mary Lou, crossed the Jordan River two months ago. Don himself crossed the Jordan River two months later. It reminded me of the widowhood effect. It is said that if a husband or wife loses his or her spouse, he or she has a 66% higher likelihood of passing away within the three months following the spouse's death. The reason might be a broken heart. Don and Mary Lou were born around 30 days apart and passed away two months apart. Their life, love, marriage, and return to heaven seemed to be destiny. While preparing for and participating in Don's funeral, I thought about true love, destiny, and the Jordan River.

On November 17th, ESOL's fall semester ended with the traditional potluck dinner and closing ceremony. Teachers and students shared favorite ethnic foods and enjoyed good fellowship. On November 21st, we had the monthly food distribution for those in need. Approximately 270 families were helped by the food ministry that day.

The Advent season began November 29. We are waiting for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. There are several church activities scheduled during December, including Breakfast with Santa, Angel Tree, the Cantata, and the Christmas Eve services. In addition, we will enjoy Fellowship Sunday on December 20th between worship services. This time, we won't have pizza. Instead, we will eat Korean food. Besides being the 4th Sunday in Advent, December 20th is called Korean Culture Awareness Sunday. My Korean friends will bring Korean food and, if possible, we will see a short video clip about Korean culture. I think this would be a good approach to make this church a vibrant, multicultural church. Please join the event.

Nowadays, I am very happy because I can listen to Christmas music on the radio. I've heard that Christmas songs are played by the media not only to celebrate the Christmas season, but to increase consumerism. As Christians, we need to stay firmly grounded in the fundamental significance of Advent and Christmas.

What exactly is a cantata?



The word 'cantata' means 'sung,' from the past participle, feminine singular form of the Italian verb *cantare*, 'to sing.' A cantata is a medium-length narrative piece of music for voices, with solos, chorus and orchestra. Famous cantata composers include Johann Sebastian Bach and George Frederick Handel.

Our cantata, "Gloria In Excelsis Deo," will be presented on December 20th at both services. The choir has been working on the music since October. We have taken six pieces of music written by different composers and connected them with scripture to tell the story of the birth of Jesus. The Praise Band, the Maranatha Choir, the Chancel Choir and Erin Mellott will join together in presenting different styles of music – contemporary Christian, German folk carol, Huron Indian, and gospel. Our accompanist will be Alexi Ulitin, from the University of Maryland.


- 1. Every Sunday, we have an opportunity to light a candle in memory of or in honor of a loved one. Who sets that up? Kathryn Griffin

"Ah-men" or "Ay-men?"

Amen is a declaration of affirmation, and means 'so be it.' The word is from the Aramaic language and is pronounced 'Ahmeen.' Later, it was absorbed into Greek, Latin, English and Arabic. The common English translation is 'verily,' or 'truly.' Amen is found in very early Hebrew scriptures, and occurs 30 times in the Old Testament and 77 times in the New Testament

Today, we hear it pronounced two ways — 'Ah-men' and 'Ay-men.' Which is the correct pronunciation? It depends on how it is used. 'Ah-men' is used in standard choral and liturgical music and in mainstream Protestant churches. 'Ay-men' is used in gospel music and in many Evangelical churches.

'Ay-men' dates to the 15th century, and is associated with Irish Protestantism. 'Ay-men' is also the result of The Great Vowel Shift in the English language. What in the world is that, you ask!!!!??? From about 1350 to 1700, the English language underwent a big change in how vowels were pronounced. European long vowels in many words changed to short vowels or became totally different vowel sounds. For example, our "bite" was originally pronounced "beet." In many parts of the British Isles, 'Ah-men' became 'Ay-men.' With the invention of the printing press, spelling became standardized even if the pronunciation changed. That's why English is so inconsistent.

We will be using 'Ah-men' in church – in our anthems, hymns, and the response to prayers. Anywhere else – take your pick. Amen!!!




