Troop 1033 Boy Scout Performs Eagle Scout Project at Emmanuel UMC by Todd Reitzel, Trustees

Another member of Boy Scout Troop 1033 has completed an Eagle Scout project, and like many previous such projects, this one has benefited the church community. Vladislav (Vlad) Kovalskiy, of Beltsville, organized a project to improve the church grounds. The project was completed on February 18, with several dozen volunteers from the troop, the community, and the church.

Improvements included clearing out undergrowth on the south side of the church property line, removing a trash pile from behind the church storage shed, moving parking ties back into place, and constructing a mulch path from the church parking lot to the church parsonage.

The project required organization and leadership, which is a hallmark of Eagle Scout projects. Vlad lined up tools, volunteers, and several trucks for hauling away trash and yard waste. He also acquired donations of mulch and beverages for use during the day. Hungry volunteers were fed lunch and worked about 6-7 hours on the various projects.

JOIN THE FINANCIAL FAST DURING LENT

Lent is a time to focus on growing closer to God. It's about being thankful for what we have and recognizing that all of our best efforts will never come close to matching the sacrifice Jesus made 2,000 years ago.

Everyone is encouraged to prayerfully participate in this year's 40-Day Lenten Financial Fast. Spend the next 40 days fasting and praying, believing that you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer to God. Set a daily financial fasting goal for yourself. For these 40 days, consider giving up a small item, such as a cup of coffee at Starbucks, a movie, or perhaps a foot-long sub. Consider packing a lunch instead of stopping for fast food.

Set aside the value of whatever you choose to forego and count it toward your financial fast goal. For example, if you cut your expenses by \$5 a day during Lent, you will have accumulated

\$200 in sacrificial giving by Easter. Drop your 40-day Lenten Fast gift in the offering plate on Easter Sunday. Every contribution, of whatever size, is welcome. Thank you, and may God richly bless you.

A LOOK BACK

The Women's Society of Christian Service of the Emmanuel Methodist Church was organized in 1940. There were 28 charter members.

The Betty Alt Circle was organized in October 1947 for young women with children. Eleven women attended that first meeting, which included a discussion on what was to be done at these types of meetings and ideas on what to do. Officers were installed and pledges were made in November 1947. The women were asked to pay a "cultivation fee" of 15 cents to become a member. They also decided to have "Sunshine Sisters" (secret sisters whom they were to remember on special occasions). At the December meeting, the members decided to name their circle the Betty Alt Circle, after a missionary in Korea.

STROKE SYMPTOMS

Stroke can happen to anybody, at any age, and at any time. Learn and share the F.A.S.T. warning signs and you might just save a life.

- **F** Face Drooping Ask the person to smile. Is the person's smile uneven or lopsided? Does one side of the face droop, or is it numb?
- A Arm Weakness Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? Is one arm weak or numb?
- **S** Speech Slurred Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence. Is the person unable to speak or hard to understand? Is the speech slurred?
- T Time To Call 911

Additional Signs -

- Sudden Numbness or Weakness of face, arm, or leg, especially on one side.
- Sudden Confusion trouble speaking or understanding.
- Sudden Trouble Seeing in one or both eyes.
- Sudden Trouble Walking dizziness, loss of balance, or coordination.
- Sudden Severe Headache with no known cause.

Good Friday observes the commemoration of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Good Friday is a day of sorrow, penance, and fasting.

Until the 4<sup>th</sup> century, Jesus' Last Supper, death, and resurrection were observed in one service in the evening before Easter. On Good Friday, there is no Mass in the Roman Catholic Church or the Easter Orthodox Church: therefore, there is no Communion. There is a service. The cross is draped in black, the altar is bare, and there is no instrumental music.

The earliest use of "guode Friday" is found in the South Legendary text from 1290 in England. The term may come from the German, "Gottes Freitag," or God's Friday. The day was called "Long Friday" by the Anglo-Saxons, and it is still referred to as such in Denmark.


