Whenever Advent begins, a play comes to my mind. The title of the play is "Waiting for Godot," written by playwright Samuel Beckett. It is considered by many to be the most significant English language play of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

The play was first performed in America in the late 1950s. Soon, the play was being produced throughout the world. In the play, the two main characters go to the same place every day to wait for the coming of someone named "Godot." Both of them wait expectantly. But every day, Godot's arrival is delayed. Their friends and neighbors tell them to stop waiting. Nevertheless, they keep waiting. This is the basic storyline of the play. What "Godot" represents is not clear in the play. Yet, the play helped me think about the meaning of waiting and, theologically speaking, of hope. The author wrote this play while he was hiding in a small French village during the Nazi occupation of France. I believe that "Godot" meant freedom to him.

Now, the world is waiting for the coming of baby Jesus. Like the two characters in the play, we wait every day for the coming of baby Jesus. Our minds are already filled with hope. Let us rejoice, because He is coming.

Several special services are planned for December. At the service on December 10<sup>th</sup>, we will accept two new members into the congregation. On December 17<sup>th</sup>, we will have a single service at 10 a.m. featuring the Cantata presented by the Chancel Choir.

December 24<sup>th</sup> falls on a Sunday this year, so we will have one Sunday worship service that morning, at 10 a.m. Sunday evening, we will have our usual two

Christmas Eve services – the Family Service at 6:30 p.m. and the Candlelight Service at 11 p.m.

I pray that all of you will have a peaceful and joyful time during the Christmas season.

#### **WELCOME, NEW MEMBERS!**

My name is **Tammy White**. I was born in 1959. I have lived in the Silver Spring area for most of my life. I was married for 33 years to Michael David White, who passed in 2014. I have two adult children, Sean White, who is married and resides in Gaithersburg, and Crystal Insel, who also is married and has a three-year-old son, Max. They live in California

I was baptized and raised Catholic, but left the church after I was married. My husband was not Catholic. I joined the Free Methodist Church and was re-baptized and raised my children in that church. I began my personal relationship with God during those years. I went on a mission trip to Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia for two weeks with 14 other Christians. During that trip, we brought more than 150 adults to the Lord. It was during that mission trip that I felt the Holy Spirit fill my soul for the first time.

In 2014, my husband passed. I continued to be very active in my church, but by 2017, I felt like I needed to move on. I was looking for another church with a contemporary service that served the community, and saw this church advertised in the Calverton directory. I came, I loved the music, everyone was warm and welcoming, and I decided this would be my new church home.

Hello everyone, my name is **Lois Schulze**. I am a native of Prince George's County. I'm retired and a widow. The first half of my working career, I taught music and various instruments in my home studio. The second half, I ran an educational program for adults. I live with my older sister and I have two cats.

I found this church through the Beltsville News while having breakfast at TJ's. I decided to try it out. I had never walked into such a warm, friendly, and loving atmosphere in my life. I first met Ms. Judy, and her smile just said, 'You've come home!' Everyone has been so friendly. People know my name and I don't even know them. This church offers so much - not only for its parishioners but for the entire community - which is what a good Methodist does.

I was raised in the Methodist Church. As an adult, I attended the Episcopal church for several decades and, not by chance but not by my design, I have found myself back into the Methodist church. I am very happy to become a member of Emmanuel's UM Church. Thank you for allowing me.

#### **Little Known Black History Facts**

Lonnie G Bunch III (American, b 1952) Educator, Historian, Museum director)



In 2005, Lonnie G Bunch 3<sup>rd</sup> was named one of the 100 most influential museum professionals of the 20<sup>th</sup> century by the American Association of Museums. In that same year, he was selected as director of the first national African American history museum, the Smithsonian's National Museum of African American History and Culture.

Since his childhood in New Jersey, Bunch has had a thirst for history. His early reading of historical biographies fueled his interest and eventually led him to history-related jobs as a teacher, curator, lecturer, documentary producer, and museum director. He received his Master's and Bachelor's degrees from American University in Washington, D.C.

From 2001 to 2005, Bunch served as president of the Chicago Historical Society, where he spearheaded a reorganization and fundraising campaign that fueled the museum's transformation for its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Prior experience included more than a decade filling various roles within several Smithsonian museums. Using well-honed managerial and curatorial skills, Bunch oversaw several major exhibits within Smithsonian museums in Washington, D.C, and at the California African American Museum in Los Angeles.

Bunch has written several books, among them Call the Lost Dream Back: Race and Museums.

As director of the National Museum of African American History and Culture, Bunch has defined the museum's mission and is developing exhibitions and public programs while coordinating the museum's fundraising and budget development. Of his directorship acceptance, Bunch said, "What I realized and what ultimately convinced me is that the Chicago Historical Society had nurtured my soul. But helping to create the museum was nurturing my ancestors." He further stated, "This museum will tell the American story and this museum is for all Americans."



The museum opened in 2016, and is located at 1400 Constitution Avenue in Washington, D.C.
