## Where There Is A Will, There Is A Way To Give

Most of us are familiar with the proverbial expression, "Where there is a will, there is a way," which simply means: If a person sets a goal or makes a decision to accomplish something, they can find a way to achieve it through commitment and determination. But here's a new twist on an old proverb: "Where there is a will, there is a way to give."

In this case, the type of "will" we are referring to is a Last Will and Testament—a written document that directs the disposition of a person's assets after death. The recipients of these assets are called beneficiaries. Beneficiaries can include family members, close friends, complete strangers, cherished pets, favored organizations, and even your local church.

In fact, when I was a pastor of three churches in Harford County, a community member passed away and left an insurance policy that included one of the churches as a beneficiary. Although that community member was not a member of the church, she believed in the church's mission and named it in her will. Naming a church, such as Emmanuel UMC Beltsville, as a beneficiary is simply a matter of completing a valid will.

In the state of Maryland, the requirements for a valid will are as follows: the will must be signed by the person making the will and attested to and signed by two credible witnesses in the presence of the person making the will. The standards of validity for wills vary from jurisdiction to jurisdiction, so it is important to know what your state of residence requires.

Additionally, not only can church members and community members name a church as a beneficiary, but so can pastors and former pastors of the church. If you do not have a will or have not updated your will recently, the start of the New Year is an excellent time to resolve to give serious attention to your posthumous giving.

Many people on the higher end of the wealth spectrum routinely give 10% of what they earn while they are alive. Whether it is 10% or 1%, after death, the money we have earned and invested during our lifetimes can still continue to do good in the life of the church—especially if we make the decision that: "Where there is a will, there is a way to give!"

### **UpStage Artists Raises \$1,280 for The Emmanuel Food Distribution!**



Dear Friends,

We give thanks for you and for your churches that raise up this ministry, pray for us and also provide donations for our programs. Many of you made donations in recent months and we feel such gratitude.

In the last months we have had different activities that we would like to share with all of you.

During July we finished our regional health meetings – basically continuing education for health promotors. In the 7 meetings in different geographic areas, nearly 80 women attended and learned about malnutrition.

In our quieter months, our staff takes advantage of the opportunity to take some refresher courses. In August some of our staff took courses on baking, electricity, health care for the elderly and English.



In the month of September and October, Betzy and Panchita, our Health Program directors, have given two workshops on "Care of the Elderly and Disabled." The women have learned the correct way to take care of an elderly or disabled person, as well as how to take their blood pressure, blood

sugar and many other very important things.
The September workshop was in the
community of Ixtepec [Indigenous and very
poor] and the October workshop was in the
community of Tepeaca, Puebla.





From October 6th to 12th our Tree of Life Center hosted the Pennsylvania AWARE [Alternative Work Study and Reality Experience] mission team. They worked on



different projects and learned more about Give Ye Them To Eat Programs as well as getting to know

Mexicans like our staff. They also did a lot of educational tourism about the history of colonialism in the city of Puebla and the history of the many

indigenous groups. They also visited the famous Cholula pyramid which is the biggest in the world in surface area. This group was led by our friend of 25 years, Marian Hartman who has brought groups at least 50 times. She is arriving soon with another team.





During these months we also received groups from different schools near Tlancualpicán to have one-day

workshops at the "Tree of Life" Center, learning a little bit about all we do.

### **Cooking with Pastor King: Mini Empanadas**

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 lb. ground beef (80/20) or ground turkey
- 1 red onion medium, chopped
- 1 packet your favorite taco seasoning
- 1 cup refried beans
- 1/2 cup cheddar cheese shredded (shredded it yourself)
- 1/2 cup pepper jack cheese shredded (shred it yourself)
- 4 pie crusts (frozen/thawed 2 packages double pie crusts) I like the Harris Teeter brand
- 1 egg beaten



Preheat oven to 400°F.


In a large skillet brown ground beef (or turkey), red onion and taco seasoning over medium heat, breaking up to crumble.

Add the refried beans and stir in cheese. Set aside to cool slightly. Meat mixture will thicken.

On a lightly floured surface, roll out a pie crust to about 1/8-inch thickness. Using a 4 inch round circular mold (I used the refried beans container lid) cut 6 circles, re-rolling dough if needed. Repeat with other pie crusts for 24 circles.

*NOTE: If you want to use only 1/2 a recipe, you can fill the other empanadas with fruit* pie filling to make 12 meat pies and 12 fruit pies.

Top each dough circle with about 2 tablespoons of the filling. Fold in half and press edges with a fork to seal. (You can use a 4-inch mold or dumpling press if you have one). Place on a parchment wax paper lined baking sheet (use a brown paper bag if nothing else is handy).



If you wind up prepping a whole batch of 24, you can freeze and seal them unbaked in an air tight freezer bag or container. At some point for future use, brush with egg wash on AFTER thawing and bake for 15 minutes until golden brown.



# History of Hymns: 'Freely, Freely (God Forgave My Sin)' By Carol Owens UMH 389

Carol Owens (b. 1931) is an Oklahoma native educated in California at San Jose State College (now University) in what has become Silicon Valley. In 1954, she married Jimmy Owens (b. 1930), a jazz band director and church musician in southern California. A part of the "Jesus Movement," they composed contemporary Christian musicals and performed throughout California. The Owenses were involved in musical missions for evangelist Jack Hayford's (1934–2023) Church of the Way in Los Angeles. They received the Christian Artists Music Achievement Award in 1986. Working with contemporary Christian artist Paul Baloche (b. 1962), they co-authored Words and Music: A Guide to Writing, Selecting and Enjoying Christian Songs (1984).

"Freely, Freely" is a song from one of the ten musicals composed by the Owens duo, Come Together: A Musical Experience in Love (1972). The original album (Light Records — LS-5592-LP) features Pat Boone. "Freely, Freely" is the final track on the first side during the worship section of the musical. The words came to Carol Owens one morning during a reading of the Gospels (Adams, 1992, p. 126).

The UM Hymnal editor Carlton R. Young, commenting on this song, finds its Scriptural roots in the Gospel of Matthew: "This gospel hymn expresses the obligation of those who have been forgiven and made new creatures in Christ to share freely (Matthew 6:12) that graceful gift to the lost and needy in the spirit of the great commission, 'Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.' (Matthew 28:19)" (Young, 1993, p. 150) The tagline "freely" comes from Matthew 10:8:

"Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out devils: freely ye have received, freely give." (KJV) Other words from the refrain paraphrase the key ideas of the great commission: "Go in my name, and because you believe, others will know that I live."

The two stanzas reflect the simple sincerity of contemporary Christian songs of the early 1970s and have the feel of bridges to the refrain rather than fully developed verses. The first stanza focuses on being "born again" (John 3:7). Stanza 2, which begins with "All power is given in Jesus' name, / in earth and heaven in Jesus' name," paraphrases Matthew 28:18.

The predominately step-wise melodic movement of the triple-meter musical setting is accessible to congregations. The diatonic harmonic setting is straightforward, allowing the song to adapt easily to various styles from folk guitar and country Western to traditional organ and piano accompaniment. The earliest hymnal to include the song was The New Church Hymnal (1976), edited by contemporary Christian pioneer and composer Ralph Carmichael (1927–2021). Subsequently, the song appears in twenty hymnals, primarily evangelical collections, including The Hymnal for Worship and Celebration (1986), Baptist Hymnal (1991 and 2008 editions), The Celebration Hymnal (1997), Complete Mission Praise (1999), and Anglican Hymns Old and New (2008).
